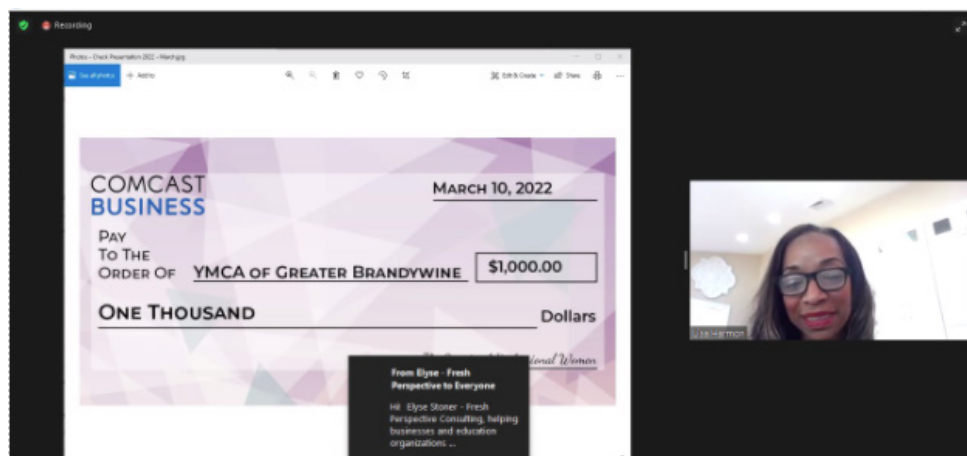

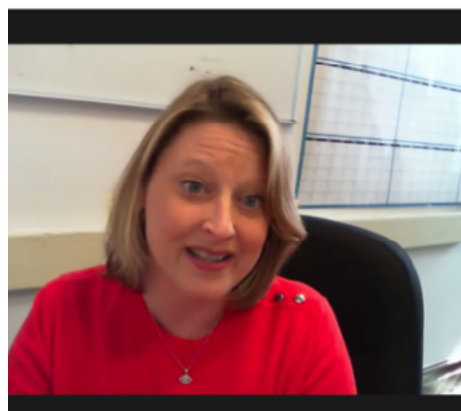

Research: We're Losing Touch with Our Networks

Harvard Business Review

- Professional and personal networks have shrunk by close to 16% — or by more than 200 people — during the pandemic.
- Under normal circumstances, our networks don't simply shrink; they're more likely to churn. Rather than slowly losing friends over time as we move, change jobs, or have kids, we usually forge new relationships to replace the ones we've lost.
- What's unusual about the pandemic is that old relationships aren't being replaced by new ones. At a time when many people are struggling with loneliness and feeling disconnected from work, it's more imperative than ever to be intentional about maintaining connections to casual acquaintances.
- During the pandemic, we've shifted our attention away from strangers toward strengthening relationships with family, friends, and our closest colleagues.
- If you think of your network as a series of six concentric circles that decrease in emotional intensity as you move toward the larger outer rings, the innermost circle contains the five or so people you turn to in times of severe emotional and financial distress.

\$300k available in The GIANT Company's Healing the Planet grant program
